We always felt safe, the accommodations are elegant and authentic, the food is worldrenowned, the geography is diverse (metropolitan Lima, the Andes mountains, Amazon Rainforest), and Peruvians are friendly—the trip was incredible.

TRIP HIGHLIGHTS ///



DAY 1 - DFW TO LIMA /// American Airlines has a direct flight to Lima. There's no time change so no jet-lag. The flight leaves in the evening so we'll sleep on the flight and arrive feeling fresh in Peru.

DAY 2 - LIMA /// We'll arrive early in the morning, drop our luggage off at the hotel and then enjoy a half-day tour of Peru's capital, including: the UNESCO-recognized Historic Center of Lima, the beautiful Plaza de Armas founded in 1535, gorgeous churches, and old mansions while learning about dramatic moments in the city's history. Late afternoon and evening on your own. [Lima hote]]

DAY 3 - LIMA TO CUSCO /// We'll take an early morning 90-minute flight to Cusco, the entrance to the Sacred Valley. This charming town, nestled in the cradle of the Andes mountains, is the "two-mile high city" with an elevation of 11,140 ft. The altitude and beauty of the city will "take your breath away" so we'll take the entire day to acclimate to the altitude. Our hotel is located a few blocks from the town center. [Cusco hotel] DAY 4 - CUSCO /// Our day-long tour will begin in the UNESCO-recognized historic center of the city. Our guided tour will include the Cusco Cathedral and the Qoricancha or Temple of the Sun. Then we'll board chartered vans and explore the countryside to see the ruins of Sacsayhuaman, Qenko, Tambomachay, and Pukapukara. [Cusco hotel]

DAY 5 - SACRED VALLEY/// The Sacred

Valley was the spiritual center of the Inca Empire, where all-powerful emperors built private estates, temples, fortifications, and thousands of agricultural terraces. The daylong tour will explore the Pisac ruins and Ollantaytambo. You'll have plenty of time to shop at famous artisan markets and explore stone-lined streets. [Sacred Valley hotel]

DAY 6 - MACHU PICCHU /// We'll take the early morning train—<u>the Vistadome</u>—to the base of the mountain, then board a bus to the foothills of Machu Picchu. For 400 years this archeological treasure remained lost to the world until a Yale professor, looking for the fountain of youth, discovered the ruins in 1911. Here's a <u>National Geographic 4-minute</u> <u>video</u> on Mach Picchu. [Sacred Valley hote]]

DAY 7 - AMAZON VALLEY /// We'll fly from

Cusco to Puerto Maldonado. Upon arrival we'll check our large luggage in town (limit of 22 pound bag into the rainforest), transfer to the port and board a boat to the Inkaterra Reserva Amazonica lodge. The lodge is adjacent to the lush Tambopata National Reserve, where the Madre de Dios river meanders through the Southern Peru rainforest region, known as the Biodiversity Capital of Peru. We'll start our tour of the Amazon in the afternoon. [Amazon hotel]

DAY 8 & 9 /// We'll have two full days of touring the Amazon including (depending on conditions): a local farm, native community, and nighttime walks. Our naturalists guides will take us on hikes to explore the rainforest ecosystem and on a canoe ride on the Madre de Dios River. The lodge will serve as our home base; all meals are provided. [Amazon hotel]

DAY 10 /// In the morning we'll take boats back to Puerto Maldonado, retrieve our luggage, fly to Lima, and back to the United States. [Your own bed]
